

## Risk Assessment for attending dual settings.



This risk assessment takes into account the document updated by the Department of Education on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2020 'Actions for early years and childcare providers during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak'

Hazard	Who is at risk?	Control Measures in Place	Notes
<p>Children attending more than one Early Years Setting will be in contact with more groups of children/people potentially increasing the risk of transmission of Covid-19.</p>	<p>All children, families and staff that have contact at any setting a child attends.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parents must inform KEYFS if their child attends another setting and provide full details of all settings attended.</li> <li>• Parents will be required to notify management at KEYFS if their child's setting changes.</li> <li>• Parents will be asked to notify management at KEYFS if their child has been in contact with another person, including children that attend their other setting, that has received a positive Covid-19 test result. (Confidentiality must be observed, KEYFS do not require names or personal data of other children)</li> <li>• KEYFS will accept children attending a maximum of ONE other setting only when it is necessary to meet parent's childcare requirements.</li> <li>• KEYFS will only share care with settings that have a risk assessment in place detailing how they are implementing their System of Control and what protective measures they are taking.</li> <li>• KEYFS must feel confident that the other setting of which the child attends are taking all possible steps identified on their risk assessment to keep children safe, management retain the right to refuse entry if there are any doubts regarding this.</li> <li>• When a child attends more than one setting, they must have a separate bag for each setting so that belongings are not transported between settings. Only plastic lunch boxes thoroughly cleaned should be used. A bag containing spare clothes left at each setting would minimise risk.</li> <li>• Parents will be required to read this risk assessment and acknowledge their own responsibility to support KEYFS in keeping all children, families and staff safe.</li> </ul>	<p>This risk assessment may change as and when government guidance changes. All other precautions set out in the 'Covid-19 Risk Assessment – Preparing for wider opening from June 1<sup>st</sup> 2020' still apply.</p>
